

This is a quiet week at Arlington Street, as the staff enjoys a "long winter's nap" after the big push of the past month. This Sunday, in keeping with a long tradition, Rev. Vera O'Brien will be in the high pulpit and Darell Waters, chair of our Worship Team, will be at the Gleason podium. Some of you knew Rev. Vera when she was on staff our Lifespan Religious Educator; in 2007, we ordained her, and she now serves as a hospital chaplain and as one of Arlington Street's community ministers. Vera and Darrell will be joined by Young Woong Cho on piano and mezzo-soprano Bek Zehr.
