Dearly Beloved,

Covenant Renewal season is here! Once a year, we renew our great covenant of love and service and make pledges of financial gifts to support our spiritual community and our work in the world. This Sunday, our beloved videographer, Rich Abreu, steps out from behind the camera to share a reflection on this year's Covenant Renewal theme, #ASCNation. In the coming weeks, you'll be hearing from more Arlington Street members about the ways our hybrid congregation has made us a #CommunityWithoutBorders. Covenant Renewal Sunday is March 5th!

Sunday's service opens with Judy Collins' *Open the Door.* In honor of Burt Bacharach, who died this week at 94, we'll sing *What the World Needs Now Is Love*, as well as Sarah Dan Jones' *Meditation on Breathing* ("When I breathe in, I breathe in love; when I breathe out, I breathe out love"), and the African American hymn, *There Is More Love Somewhere*.

As we hold the people of Turkey and Syria in our hearts in the wake of Monday's devastating earthquake, the Arlington Street Church Choir sings *Adinu*, a chant-like, contemplative song based on a poem on the nature of love by Sufi mystic, poet, and philosopher Ibn 'Arabi. He says, "I believe in the religion of love." The choral arrangement is by conductor, ethnomusicologist, human rights activist, and professor of music at Boston University André de Quadros and Shireen Abu Khadaer, a Palestinian Jordanian artist, composer, and educator now living in Canada.

My sermon is called *Presence*. As we were putting together the service, Director of Music Mark David Buckles played and sang me a little of Benj Pasek and Justin Paul's *You Will Be Found* from Dear Evan Hansen. Get ready for Mark David and Bek Zehr on vocals, Hyunju Jung on piano, Julie Metcalf on violin, and Sam LaGrego on cajon:

There's a place where we don't have to feel unknown And every time that you call out You're a little less alone If you only say the word From across the silence your voice is heard

You will be found You will be found You will be found You will be found
