Chao, one of the early 20th century's leading Protestant thinkers in China, and John Andrew Story, a late 20th century British Unitarian minister. The music is by early 20th century Chinese musician Te-ngai Hu.

As the spinning globe rolls away the night Nature wears a robe spun of morning light Dawn break in me too, as in skies above Teach me to be true, fill my heart with love Director of Music Mark David Buckles (guitar and vocals) and soprano Hannah Shanefield sing Antje Duvekot's *Sweet Spot.* Rev. Beth Robbins, our Executive Minister, is preaching a sermon called *Don't Miss It* — a deep dive into sweet serendipity.
