
Before I tell you about Sunday's service, a reminder that there's \*a lot\* happening just afterwards:

p.s. A final request to take <u>this short survey</u>: Our Transformation Team for Racial Justice is seeking your input on making institutional, systemic anti-racist change and embodying racial justice as a spiritual practice.

This past Wednesday, the conversation prompt for the ministers' weekly tea party was, What quality do you most appreciate in a friend? Here were some of our answers: "Glass half-full" optimism; being helpful — being a doer; rolling with the punches; showing up/being there; acceptance; being able to be all of who you are; reflecting my best self back to me; kindness; telling me when I'm wrong while understanding how self-critical I am; the willingness to be quiet together; after a rain: not stepping on the worms together; wealth and generosity(!); the courage to be honest and true; being open and honest and challenging me to be the same; loyalty and continuity; knowing everything about me and still loving me; reciprocity; graciousness; civility; "portability" (you can take them everywhere); being non-judgmental; ease; simpatico; wisdom; humor; unconditional love; intimacy: being real, going deep; comfort; being able to pick up where you left off with them, no matter how much time has passed; their capacity to see my best self; nurturing; open-mindedness.
