

This Sunday, we celebrate Easter! For starters, Director of Music Mark David Buckles has arranged our three big Easter hymns for orchestra ... and yes, there will be an orchestra!

Mark David will conduct the Arlington Street Church Choir and ten-piece orchestra (!) in 36-year-old American composer Jake Runestad's *Into the Light*. This five-movement cantata features the wisdom of Frederick Douglass, Helen Keller, Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., and Rabindranath Tagore, among other luminaries.

Jazz Artist in Residence Joe della Penna will sing and play Irving Berlin's Easter Parade! My sermon is called *Practice Resurrection*. And we'll close with one of our favorite Easter traditions. In the 1700s, Methodist minister Charles Wesley wrote *Jesus Christ is Risen Today*. In the following century, Unitarian minister Samuel Longfellow commandeered the same tune and rewrote the words: *Lo, The Earth Awakes Again*. The choice of which words to sing is yours —

Death in vain forbids him rise Christ has opened paradise

or

Change, then, mourning into praise And, for dirges, anthems raise

As with our celebration of many of the big Christian holidays, it can be fun to go for tradition, or, alternatively, to sing in affirmation of what we deeply believe. Whatever you choose to sing, we'll all end up together at Alleluia!
