### The Meaning of the Fourth of July for the Negro: Reading Frederick Douglass in the Era of Barack Obama

Saturday, July 4<sup>th</sup>, 11:00 AM, Harriet Tubman Park

In his fiery July 5<sup>th</sup>, 1852 speech, the great abolitionist and orator, Frederick Douglass, took exception to being asked to commemorate the signing of the Declaration of Independence... and on March 18<sup>th</sup>, 2008 Barack Obama challenged all Americans while delivering his "race" speech, "*I have never been so naïve as to believe that we can get beyond our racial division in a single election cycle. Race is an issue this nation cannot afford to ignore right now. To work for 'a more perfect union' we need to start to understand complexities that we've never really worked through. [This] requires*
