### The Wednesdays: Three Chinese Poets

Wednesdays, January 6<sup>th</sup>, 13<sup>th</sup>, and 27<sup>th</sup>, 6:00 – 8:00 PM, Frothingham Library (please note that we do NOT meet on January 20<sup>th</sup>)

Join Professor Alan Helms and Rev. Kim for our latest literary adventure at Arlington Street's *The Wednesdays* literary salon: Three Chinese poets! Read on for Prof. Alan's instructions and admonitions. All are welcome!

The tradition of Russian literature is less than 200 years old; French literature is about 600 years old; English literature 1200 years old; Persian literature 1400 years old; Chinese literature 3000 years old. There's universal agreement that the golden age of Chinese poetry occurred in the eighth century during the Tang dynasty. We'll be studying the three best Tang dynasty poets, all of them giants of world literature: Wang Wei, Li Bai (also known as Li Po), and Du Fu (also known as Tu Fu). All three poets are easily accessible and deeply moving, writing largely about simple things in a world of evanescent beauty. Their emotions are understated but powerful, and they're probably more attuned to nature than any other poets who ever wrote.

Our text is *The Anchor Book of Chinese Poetry*, edited by Tony Barnstone and Chou Ping. You'll find many cheap copies at [abebooks.com](http://abebooks.com) and [Amazon.com](http://Amazon.com). Please be sure to get the book well in advance of our first meeting so that you can read not only the poems of Wang Wei but also the “Preface” and “Introduction to Chinese Poetic Form.” These two essays are absolutely essential for the success of our study. Anyone who doesn't read them will be seriously hobbled in this course.

January 6: Wang Wei plus the two essays

January 13: Li Bai/Li Po

January 27: Du Fu/Tu Fu

Each selection runs 15 – 20 pages and many of the poems are short, some only four lines long, but if you've been in a previous poetry course in *The Wednesdays* at Arlington Street Church, you'll know that I expect people to re-read a lot and also to **READ EVERYTHING OUT LOUD!!!** Otherwise there's really no point; you'd just be wasting your time.

A course in Chinese poetry represents a very new direction for *The Wednesdays* and I'm tremendously excited about it. I hope you are too! Welcome aboard.

If your child grows restless during worship, please be welcome to bring her or him to the nursery (located off of the Chapel, through the leather door). The service is piped-in, so you won't miss a word, and your child will be happy.
