Arlington Street kicks off the 2008-2009 Music@ASC Concert Series with an afternoon recital of sonatas for violin and piano! Pianist Rumi Naito and violinist Alistair Leon Kok present works by three classical masters: Bach, Mozart, and Brahms!

##### Inside Out Concert

Engage with classical music through the creative listening approach developed by musician Eli Epstein and Cynthia Ann Hale as members of the Boston Symphony Orchestra perform Darius Milhaud's "La Cheminee du roi Rene" and Irving Fine's "Partita for Wind Quintet!" At Inside Out concerts, audience members are guided through narration and demonstration to listen imaginatively into the emotional layers of music. As memories and associations are evoked through the music, connections are made to universal emotional themes. Many concert goers report that their Inside Out listening experience is unique, meaningful, and changes the way they think about classical music.

### **The Wednesdays Literary Salon: Yeats**


Wednesday, September 17<sup>th</sup>, at 6:00 PM in the Frothingham Library
