Environmental Justice & Climate Crisis Team

Compost is decayed organic material, like food and paper, that can end up as trash—or be put to many eco-friendly uses, such as fertilizer. Why compost? If we don't, food waste ends up in a landfill or an incinerator. As we work to mitigate climate change, one important strategy is to reduce trash. The EPA estimates more food (75 billion+ pounds per year) reaches landfills and incinerators than any other material in trash. Members of this team plan to tackle the task of finding creative uses for the compostable waste ASC generates. Stay tuned!
