There's universal agreement that the golden age of Chinese poetry occurred in the eighth century during the Tang dynasty. We'll be studying the three best Tang dynasty poets, all of them giants of world literature: Wang Wei, Li Bai (also known as Li Po), and Du Fu (also known as Tu Fu). All three poets are easily accessible and deeply moving, writing largely about simple things in a world of evanescent beauty. Their emotions are understated but powerful, and they're probably more attuned to nature than any other poets who ever wrote. Our text is The Anchor Book of Chinese Poetry, edited by Tony Barnstone and Chou Ping.
