# Bach Solo Cello Suites - Guy Fishman, Artist in Residence

His time here has featured performances of all six of Johann Sebastian Bach's solo cello suites, which he will be recording this year. Mr. Fishman's visit today marks the final installment; he will perform Suite No. 6 in Major BWV 1012 on a historical fivestringed cello. Bach's cello suites were most likely composed between 1717 and 1723. Nearly 300 years later, they continue to be regarded as some of the greatest works ever written for the instrument.
