Come Learn from the Louis D. Brown Peace Institute

Sunday, November 10th ~ 12:30 PM, Hunnewell Chapel

The Louis D. Brown Peace Institute is a center of healing, teaching, and learning for families and communities impacted by murder, trauma, grief, and loss. Louis D. Brown was 15 and a 10th grader at West Roxbury High School in the fall of 1993, where his interests included music, reading, and Nintendo. He had plans to get a doctoral degree in aerodynamic engineering and dreams of becoming the first African-American U.S. president. His dreams were cut short when, on the way to a Teens Against Gun Violence Christmas party, he was caught in cross-fire and killed. Louis' mother, Chaplain Clementina M. Chéry, co-founded the Peace Institute the year after her son was murdered. Since then, Chaplain Chéry has trained thousands of public health and criminal justice professionals, law enforcement officials, and religious leaders in the best practices for supporting survivors and interrupting cycles of retaliatory violence.

Come learn more about the important work of this organization and ways you can have an impact. Chaplain Chéry will share information about the Survivors of Homicide Victims Awareness Month (November 20 - December 20), a month-long effort to educate the public and policymakers about the impact of murder on families and communities and to recognize the diverse contributions of the survivor's movement.
