Thanks to all of you who raised your hands for Fund a Dream at Indulge to put the roof back up over our heads, raising over \$25,000 in just a few short minutes! Amidst our celebration, there's one serious note: The contractors discovered that, in addition to the 25 slates that needed to be replaced, the rubber roof -- more than 30 years old and past its warranty -- had failed. They went ahead and made the necessary repairs, but the price tag swelled another \$10,000.
