#### SHARE THE PLATE: NEADS SERVICE DOGS



Founded in 1976, NEADS (National Education for Assistance Dog Services) trains service dogs. NEADS puppies are raised by inmates at New England prisons; train at the NEADS headquarters in Princeton, Massachusetts; and are then matched with adults and children seeking greater independence from physical and developmental disabilities. NEADS dogs are also matched with

professional caregivers to provide therapeutic assistance in settings such as classrooms, hospitals, courthouses, and mental health practices. NEADS also offers their Trauma Assistance Dog (TAD) program for veterans diagnosed with combat-related post-traumatic stress.
