Our intent is to help caregivers and communities develop a deeper understanding of these diseases, and nurture the belief that deep, meaningful relationships remain possible throughout all the stages of dementia.”

Rev. Jade’s new book, both a spiritual memoir and pastoral guide, is entitled *Where Two Worlds Touch*. In it, she shares the reassuring words of someone who has been there and can give advice on preserving connection, finding hope, and staying open to the possibility of grace.

Loving Labor ..... Mary Marcel

Mary Marcel was born in western PA on a small farm. She completed her BA in Slavic Languages and MA in Rhetoric and Communication Studies at the University of Virginia. She earned her doctorate in Rhetoric at the University of California at Berkeley, where she helped to unionize teaching assistants, and start a department of Multicultural Bisexual, Lesbian, Gay and Transgender Studies. Mary has been an Arlington Street member since 1994, and is now on the Prudential Committee. She teaches intercultural, persuasive, and managerial communication at Bentley University in Waltham, and is currently working on a book analyzing newspaper coverage of the priest sex crisis. Her essay on RuPaul's Drag Race will be available January 2015.
