There Is a Crack in Everything Tina Rose

The sermon title comes from a line in the chorus of "Anthem," Leonard Cohen's impassioned ballad. Brené Brown uses it as a seminal theme in her book *The Gifts of Imperfection*. Tina will explore Brown's ideas about embracing our imperfections and how working towards a wholehearted life is founded on courage, fueled by compassion, and supported by connection. She will also share a personal story of one of her 'unravelings.'

Tina Rose arrived at Arlington Street for Pride Day in 2011 wearing an iridescent purple wig, baby pink bustier, micro mini skirt, and 5" stilettos. She fit right in! After being a regular guest for two years, she became a member in 2013.
