Louis D. Brown Peace Institute's Mother's Day Walk for Peace



Sharing our resources transforms both ourselves and our world. We share our Sunday offering with a partner in our mission of love, service, justice, and peace.

In 1993, Louis D. Brown was a 15-year-old 10th grader growing up in Roxbury with very big dreams: college, graduate school, a doctoral degree in aerodynamic engineering. Ultimately, Louis wanted to be the first African-American and youngest-ever President of the United States. That fall, on his way to a Teens Against

Gang Violence meeting, Louis was killed in the crossfire of a gang shootout.

In 1994, his extraordinary mother, Tina Chéry, honored her son's dream by founding The Louis D. Brown Peace Institute. Dedicated to education in peacemaking and nonviolence, the institute also assists survivors of homicide victims.

The Mother's Day Walk for Peace is a beloved, 29-year-long Boston tradition and an important fundraiser for the Peace Institute. The theme this year is Cultivating Cycles of Peace.
